The beginning of this green season has been a bit bracing as far as Gospel texts are concerned. We've heard Jesus send out the disciples to "cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons" (Matt. 10:8); then we heard Him say that He didn't come to bring peace, but a sword and set families against each other (Matt. 10:34-37). Even in the parables there is a sense of warning, of unease, in His words. The seeds that are snatched away by birds or choked by thorns, the weeds among the wheat left to grow until harvest when they will be bound up and thrown into the furnace of fire, "where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." (Matt. 13:42). Pretty heavy going for these

long, lazy summer days.

The truth is, Jesus came to turn things upside down and inside out. And challenging accepted norms makes people uncomfortable. If you don't think so, re-read the Sermon on the Mount.

You have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, "You shall not murder." But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister, you will be liable to judgement; and if you insult a brother or sister, you will be liable to the council; and if you say, "You fool", you will be liable to the hell of fire.

You have heard that it was said, "You shall not commit adultery." But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

You have heard that it was said, "You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy." But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.

This is pretty challenging stuff. This is Jesus showing people that it's not just the letter of the Law that matters, it's the spirit as well. You can't separate Law-keeping from other aspects of life. Jesus comes along to re-orient God's people back along God's priorities. That is, care for the widows, the orphans and the strangers in the land. And He challenges their understanding of what it means to have God's favor.

'Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.'

Into a world that sees the poor, the grieving, and the humble as lesser, that sees people who don't agree with their understanding of God as sinners who are getting what they deserve, Jesus preaches the opposite: These are the people who *have* God's favor. God loves and cares for all people, whether they know Him or not. And we are to care for them as well.

There's been a lot of talk about challenging accepted norms and shaking things up lately. But it seems like people are challenging and shaking up the wrong things, choosing to make the lives of those who are struggling or marginalized even more difficult. We are called, we are sent into the world, to do what Jesus did. Jesus confronted the leaders of the people and questioned how they were living out not only the letter of the Law, but the spirit. He showed them their hypocrisy and invited them into a new way of living. He didn't scold or demean them, but demonstrated in word and in deed the new Kingdom God was inaugurating. A Kingdom where the last are first, the least are favored and the mercy and love of God is found not in a palace or a temple, but on a cross.

Monthly Financial Update

Miscellaneous Revenues

The Revenues taken into account are all weekly and holiday offerings as well as special offerings designated to the general account such as Fuel, Missions, and Food Shelf Offerings. This comparison is only for Revenues and Expenses associated with Bethel's responsibility for our parish budget, meaning checks from Hemnes Lutheran Church are not included in the Year to Date Revenue and their 25% share of our



parish budget is not included in the Year to Date Budgeted Expenses. This comparison also does not take into account Refunds and Reimbursements or Savings Reimbursements. These sources of revenue are normally received to pay expenses that are not a part of Bethel's operating budget, so are not used to make comparison to our budgeted expenses.

The Year to Date difference will show on a monthly basis if we are receiving sufficient offerings to cover our budget, or if we are behind. The running total for each month will be in a Year to Date total, not a monthly total.

If it is necessary to borrow money from Savings Reserves to fund the operations of Bethel, the amount will be denoted in the Cash Reserves Expended column. If funds are repaid to the Savings Reserves during a surplus, the repayment will be denoted in the Cash Reserves Repaid column. Reserves Expended and Reserves Repaid are not represented in the Revenues and Expenses columns of this report.


