The Gospel readings for Year A (which is this year) are ones that have been used since the early church to teach those preparing for baptism. The forty days of Lent (Sundays don't count!) developed as a time for the catechumens (the ones preparing for baptism) to pray and fast and learn the faith before their baptism at the Easter Vigil. And these readings out of the Gospel according to St. John were primary. Until the Church adopted the three year schedule of readings, these were the texts heard every year during Lent.

After we contemplate Jesus in the wilderness for forty days we hear about Nicodemus coming to Jesus by night. He had what he probably thought was a very strange conversation about being born again and the power of the Spirit and finally the amazing declaration that “God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him.”

Next we sit with Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well and listen to their conversation about worship and her life and the astonishing declaration of Jesus that, “Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.”

Jesus restores sight to a man born blind next, but he hardly speaks. Instead, we find ourselves as bystanders in a dispute between the man who was blind and the Pharisees. It's a fascinating conversation/argument—they even bring his parents in at one point—and includes a wonderful witness to Jesus, “...though I was blind, now I see. ... We know that God does not listen to sinners, but He does listen to one who worships Him and obeys His will. Never since the world began has it been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a person born blind. If this man were not from God, He could do nothing.”

And then, finally, we get the extraordinary story of Jesus, Mary, Martha and Lazarus. This text is remarkable in so many ways, it's hard to find just one to zero in on. Jesus delaying His travel until He knows Lazarus has died, the conversation with Martha and then with Mary, Jesus weeping at Lazarus' tomb and, finally, His command, “Lazarus, come out!” A command Lazarus obeys. This one story brings together all of the others—demonstrating not only Jesus' power but also the love and salvation of God, summed up in Jesus great proclamation: “I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in Me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never die.” It also launches us into Holy Week, for at the end we overhear the chief priests and Pharisees talking together and openly planning to put Jesus to death.

These stories out of the Gospel of John have formed and shaped the Christian life for centuries. As we hear again about our God, Who gave us His only begotten Son Who quenches our thirst, heals our infirmities and gives us life, we give thanks for our own baptisms. And as we contemplate the great love of our God demonstrated in the life, death and resurrection of His Son, we are, I hope, moved not only to deeper faith, but are filled with hope and joy for the future. A hope and joy that then leads us out into the world God so loves to continue to work in His name.

A note from the Canby Area Food Shelf

“Greetings!

As you may well know, financial strain and hunger have affected many Minnesotans this year. With the continuation of the pandemic, rising cost of goods and services, and changes to the work force, many families in Yellow Medicine County are struggling to make ends meet. When emergencies arise, people are often forced to choose between buying food, paying rent, childcare, medication or housing.

No one can grow, maintain good health, or reach their full potential if they are hungry. With a **tax-deduction of \$300**, you can supply a family of four with a 3-day emergency supply of food once a month for a year. This is equivalent to only **\$25 a month**. All donations received by the food shelf stay in Yellow Medicine. **March Campaign donations are proportionately matched by Minnesota Food Share!**

Celebrate 150 with Bethel

The Impact of 150

As Bethel Lutheran Church celebrates its 150th Anniversary in 2023, we want to celebrate the impact that our congregation makes on the church, our community and the world through what we are calling “The Impact of 150”

A 150 challenge of benevolence for our congregation

Throughout the course of our anniversary year, we are challenging each member of our congregation to make a goal of providing an additional \$150.00 to your giving to Bethel through a Special “150 Impact” offering. You can choose to provide your \$150.00 impact offering all at once, as a monthly donation of approximately \$13 or on a weekly basis of \$3.00. The goal is provide \$150.00 during this anniversary year so that you are a part of the lasting impact on your congregation for years to come. This effort will conclude February 28, 2024.

These offerings will be used to replenish Bethel’s Reserve Fund which is utilized to compensate for short-term shortfalls in our general fund when our regular offering does not meet what is needed to pay our monthly operating expenses.

A 150 challenge of benevolence from our congregation

Each month during our 150th Anniversary, the congregation will provide a gift of \$150.00 to a cause of our choice outside of Bethel. This may be a local impact project to meet the specific need of a member of our congregation, an outreach to our local community, or a program that is making a difference throughout the world. This monthly impact will be provided through the Bethel Manna Fund and be a unique way for our congregation to make a difference wherever we find the need!

We will designate the “Coins for Community” as the \$150 benevolence monthly cause. In addition, the congregational “coins” offering will be matched dollar for dollar to a maximum of an additional \$150 by the Manna Fund. Potentially the monthly impact could be \$450 to the chosen monthly outreach.

The Deacons will take “coins for community” suggestions for the monthly efforts. Please give us suggestions.

Monthly Financial Update

Miscellaneous Revenues

The Revenues taken into account are all weekly and holiday offerings as well as special offerings designated to the general account such as Fuel, Missions, and Food Shelf Offerings. This comparison is only for Revenues and Expenses associated with Bethel's responsibility for our parish budget, meaning checks from Hemnes Lutheran Church are not included in the Year to Date Revenue and their 25% share of our parish budget is not included in the Year to Date Budgeted Expenses. This comparison also does not take into account Refunds and Reimbursements or Savings Reimbursements. These sources of revenue are normally received to pay expenses that are not a part of Bethel's operating budget, so are not used to make comparison to our budgeted expenses.



The Year to Date difference will show on a monthly basis if we are receiving sufficient offerings to cover our budget, or if we are behind. The running total for each month will be in a Year to Date total, not a monthly total.

If it is necessary to borrow money from Savings Reserves to fund the operations of Bethel, the amount will be denoted in the Cash Reserves Expended column. If funds are repaid to the Savings Reserves during a surplus, the repayment will be denoted in the Cash Reserves Repaid column. Reserves Expended and Reserves Repaid are not represented in the Revenues and Expenses columns of this report.


