Christmas is officially over. It only lasts twelve days after all – from the 25^{th} of December to the 6^{th} of January. It is, by far, the shortest season of the church year. Advent is four weeks, Lent is forty days (not counting Sundays), Easter is seven weeks. Christmas? Only twelve measly days to rejoice in the incredible news that our God sent His Son to earth to be born as a human child – to be one of us! But for all that Christmas is important, more important is what Jesus came to earth to do.

The central event of Jesus' incarnation for us is His death on the cross and resurrection. Our salvation is not in His birth, but in His death. So the central festivals for the Christian Church are Lent, Holy Week, and Easter. Jesus moving toward the cross, Jesus dying for us, Jesus rising from the dead. This is what we are all about as people of God. Our main festivals celebrate the wonderful gift of salvation given to us by God.

Epiphany tends to get lost between Christmas and Lent, which is unfortunate. Epiphany comes from the Greek and means "manifestation" or "revelation". On the surface, it's a celebration of the Magi from the East who came to bring gifts to the baby Jesus. But it goes deeper than that. The Wise Men who brought gifts to the infant Jesus were the first Gentiles to acknowledge Jesus as King and so were the first to "show" or "reveal" Jesus to a wider world as the incarnate Christ. This act of worship by the Magi was one of the first indications that Jesus came for all people, of all nations, of all races, and that the work of God in the world would not be limited to only a few. In Isaiah we read, "Nations shall come to Your (that is God's) light, and kings to the brightness of Your dawn." Je-sus fulfills this ancient promise – He is not just a child in Ju-dea, but a treasure for the whole human race

The light of Epiphany is directly on Jesus this season. We will hear of His baptism and revelation as God's own Son. We will watch as word begins to spread, as His disciples begin to invite others to "come and see" and as Jesus calls His first four. We hear Him radically redefining who are the blessed – not the wealthy or spiritually powerful, but the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek – and teaching the people to follow not just the letter but the spirit of the Law. "You have heard it said, 'You shall not murder' ... but I say that if you insult a brother or sister ... you will be liable to the hell of fire." (Matt. 5:21-22) Finally, we will see Jesus not only in the spotlight but shining "like the sun, and His clothes became dazzling white" in the transfiguration.

All through this season our texts will point us back to the One the Wise Men came to worship. Jesus and His mis- sion is the center of attention. All of these events are leading us to the most important part of the drama: Jesus' death and resurrection. Week in and week out, it is Christ who is the center of our focus. He is our gift, our leader, and our teacher.

Be on the lookout for God around you this Epiphany season. You might be surprised where He turns up. Come, and see what He provides. See where His light leads you to serve and invite others to join you as you gather around the light. And finally, in the post-Christmas quiet, spend some time renewing your relationship with the Child in the manger. Wise men, and women, seek Him still.



Monthly Financial Update

Miscellaneous Revenues

The Revenues taken into account are all weekly and holiday offerings as well as special offerings designated to the general account such as Fuel, Missions, and Food Shelf Offerings. This comparison is only for Revenues and Expenses associated with Bethel's responsibility for our parish budget, meaning checks from Hemnes Lutheran Church are not included in the Year to Date Revenue and their 25% share of our



parish budget is not included in the Year to Date Budgeted Expenses. This comparison also does not take into account Refunds and Reimbursements or Savings Reimbursements. These sources of revenue are normally received to pay expenses that are not a part of Bethel's operating budget, so are not used to make comparison to our budgeted expenses.

The Year to Date difference will show on a monthly basis if we are receiving sufficient offerings to cover our budget, or if we are behind. The running total for each month will be in a Year to Date total, not a monthly total.

If it is necessary to borrow money from Savings Reserves to fund the operations of Bethel, the amount will be denoted in the Cash Reserves Expended column. If funds are repaid to the Savings Reserves during a surplus, the repayment will be denoted in the Cash Reserves Repaid column. Reserves Expended and Reserves Repaid are not represented in the Revenues and Expenses columns of this report.
